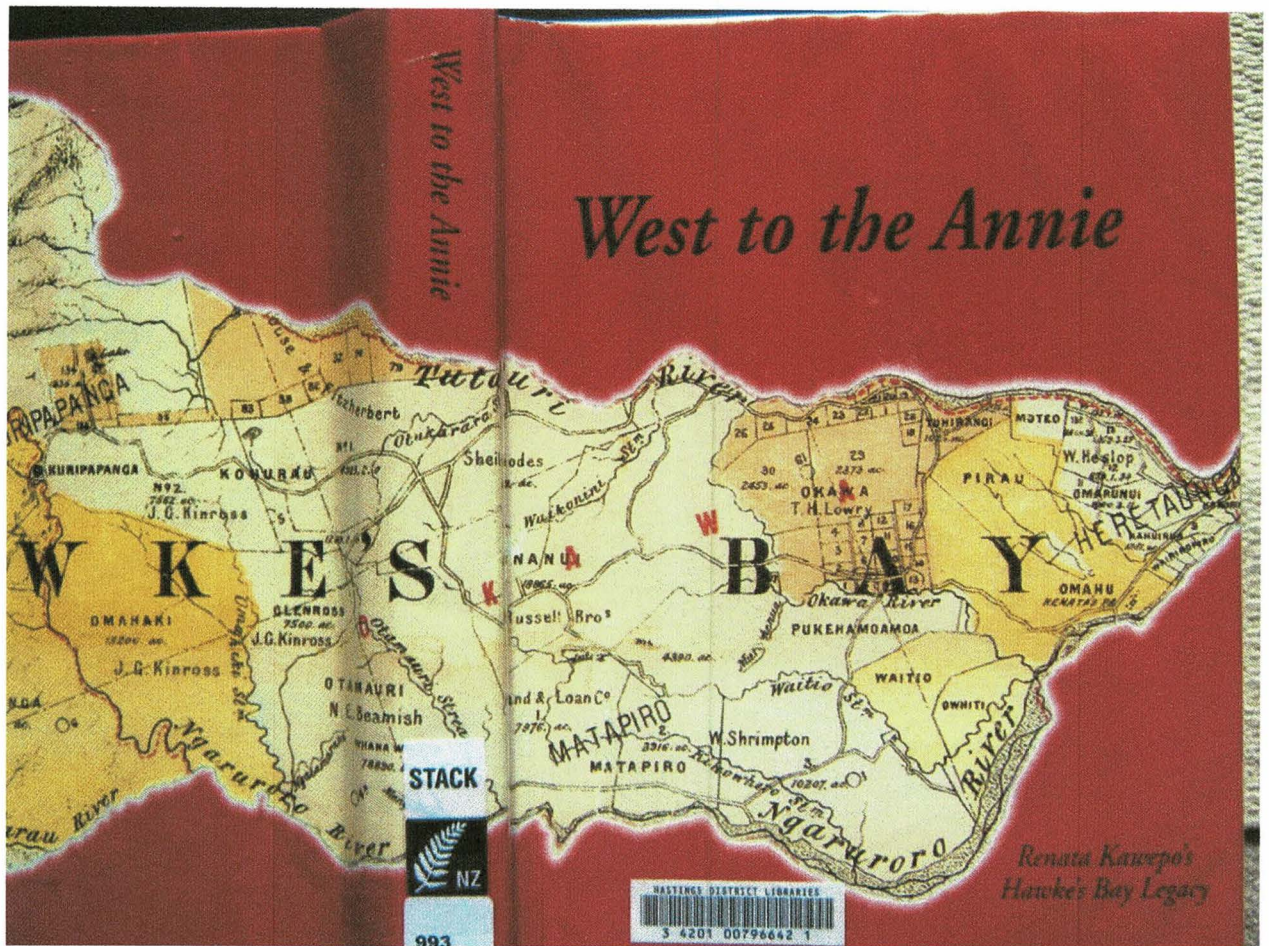

the Ngaruroro River. The vegetation was high fern and on the western side dense scrub.

Omahaki was originally 15,710 acres in extent and a stock route is known to have passed through it from Whana Whana to Kuripapango. Whether it was included in the Kereru outstation together with Whana Whana in the 1860s and 1870s has yet to be ascertained. By 1879 it was under lease to J.G. Kinross as part of Glenross and may have been previously.

An application for a Crown Grant was heard in the Native Land Court on 29.7.1886. Airini Donnelly was the applicant and there being no counterclaimant the judgement was awarded in her

favour. Wi Broughton indicated that Renata Kawepo was counter-claiming but was unaware that the hearing was under way. As a result the Crown Grant wasn't finalised.¹⁴

Omahaki was surveyed by George Walker of Nuhaka in 1889. Part of his work was based on a previous survey by Bristed and Lessong which appears in Bristed's 1889 map of Hawke's Bay. It wasn't until 29.1.1895 that Omahaki was brought back before the Court for completion of proceedings by receiving a list of names and making an order. This was completed on 4.2.1895.¹⁵
