 (and questioned) in Week 11 hearings at Moawhango.



Mandating timeline

- Draft mandate strategy advertised Dec 2017
- Submissions 2018 and Engagement Hui
- Amended mandate strategy was approved by Runanga Feb 2019
- Mandate Hui held May 2019, including postal vote by registered
 MPWCT members. Thank you to all those who supported.
- Vote was successful: 80% in favour
- MPWCT is now drafting the Deed of Mandate which goes to the public for submissions (including submissions from Runanga and our members).
 Please continue to get involved in that process.
- MPWCT as Mandated Entity commences negotiations mid- 2020
 (Note, anticipated closing subs in Waitangi Tribunal hearings is mid-2020)

Figure #1: Current Runanga structure with Hinemanu representation




Figure #2: New structure: additional Hinemanu seats based on her children's lines

Hapū Engagement Strategy

- Communication with Claimants
- Communication with Registered Members of MPWCT
- Communication with Runanga delegates
- Specific Engagement with Ngati Hinemanu on a Hapū basis
 - Hui a-Hapū for Ngati Hinemanu held on 16 March 2019
 - o Ongoing communication with Ngati Hinemanu ki Omahu
 - Engagement with Ngati Hinemanu me Ngati Paki Heritage Trust (4 hui in 2018 between MPWCT and NHNPHT; Heritage Trust were allowed to present during the mandate hui)
 - MPWCT continue to be available to dialogue and engage.
 - Unfortunately, Heritage Trust have written to Ministers challenging the voting processes. The allegations are baseless, and have been responded to.

Hapū Capacity

- Exciting times ahead, as our hapū undertake research, establish whanaungātanga links, and look for develop opportunities
- Hapū representation by way of delegate seats on each Rūnanga allow for clear feedback regarding Hapū aspirations

Hui a-Tau Timelines for Runanga

- Runanga were to hold Hui a-Tau for Elections (under Phase I) by
 June 2019 to appoint "Initial Trustees" for MPWCT
- Initial Trustees will hold office for <u>12 months</u> from date of Crown acceptance of MPWCT Deed of Mandate (early 2020?)
- Elected Delegates then appoint MPWCT trustees (staggered basis)
- Four year cycle Runanga elections all under Phase II by 2023
