Waitangi Tribunal claims update

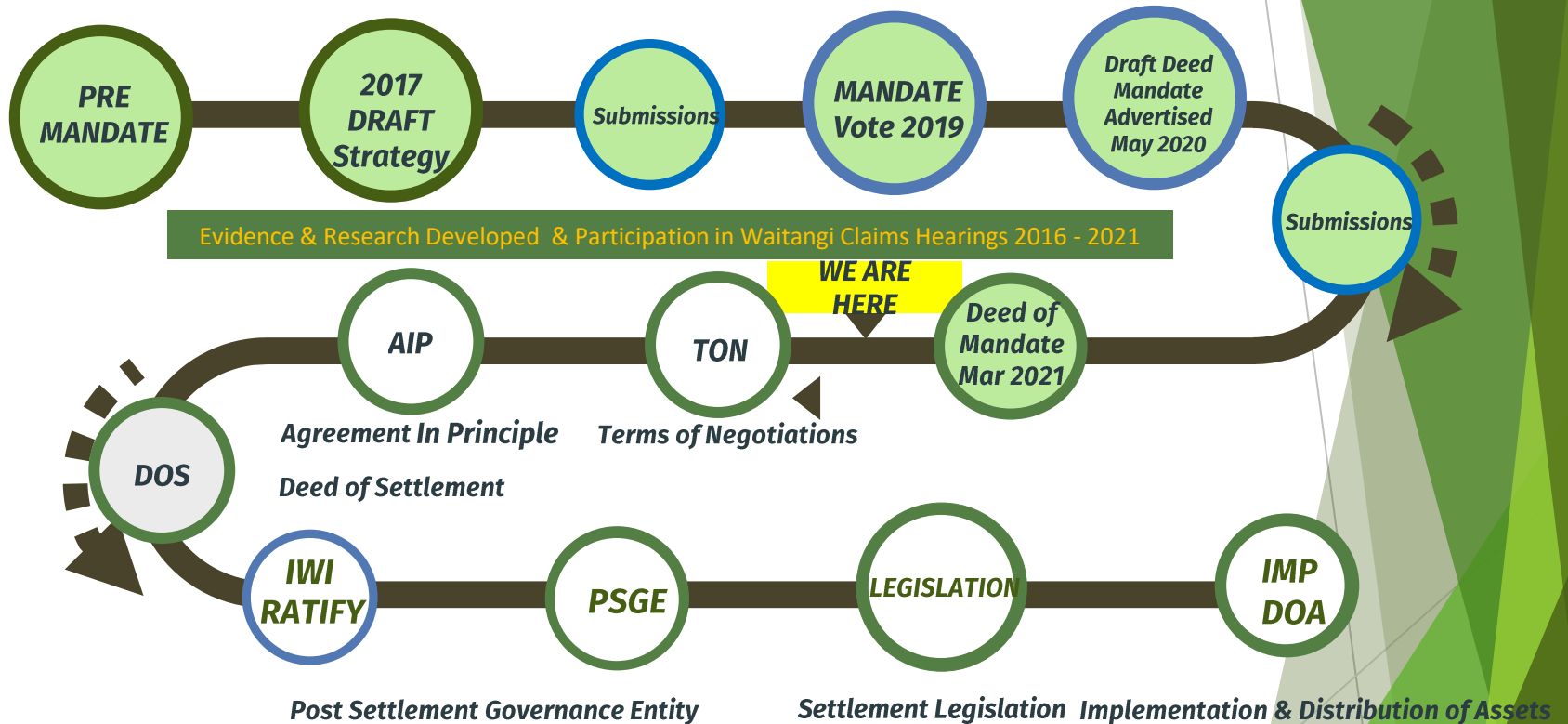
- Final Crown Closing submissions on 21 issues completed
- Then Claimant response to Closing Submissions – Kua Mutu! To be heard 4 October Wellington.
- Hearing's process concluded and Tribunal deliberate to write their report(s)
 - Tribunal may release an early Landlocked Lands report this year



Settlement Negotiations Update

- Pre-Mandate
- Deed of Mandate – **recognised by the Crown 17 March 2021**
- **Terms of Negotiations *** (*we are here now)
 - Signing planned for 20 September 2021 Wellington (Subject to Covid-19 conditions)
- Agreement in Principle (AIP)
- Deed of Settlement (DOS)
- Post-Settlement Governance Entity (PSGE)
- Ratification by the Iwi
- Settlement Legislation
- Implementation and Distribution of Assets

Implementation of the Deed of Mandate and Mandate Maintenance

- Negotiating Team appointment process being developed
- Recruitment of Negotiators guided by:
 - Geographic spread
 - Fair representation of iwi Rūnanga
 - Skills and experience
 - Experience in negotiations
- Other Accountability processes in the Deed of Mandate
- MPWCT have also committed to developing particular Redress Strategies to guide negotiations

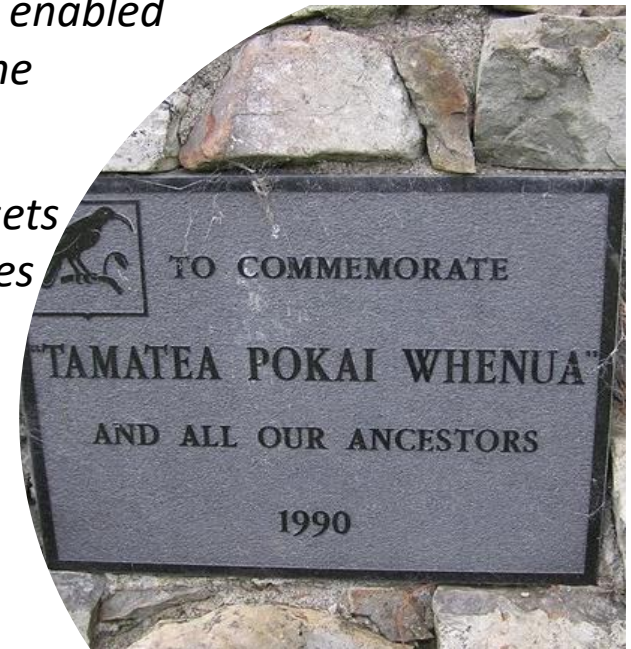

Iwi and hapū that productively utilise their estate and assets and nurture their natural resources and strengthen the ties between whenua and people.

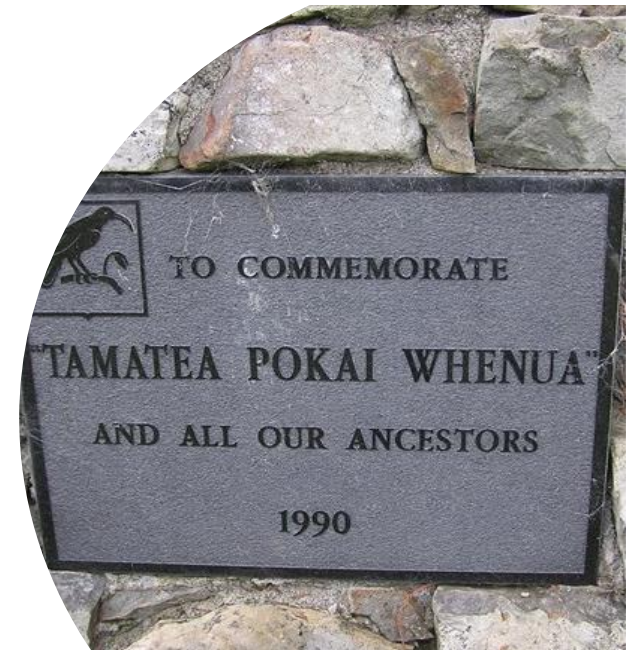
Iwi with hapū & marae that are resilient, thriving and people who are socially and economically successful.
