

Aorangi Awarua Trust

The original terms of the loan are:

Interest is payable at 5% per annum, the loan is unsecured and repayable on the earlier of 1 February 2015, or on full and final settlement of the historical Treaty of Waitangi claims for Mokai Patea Confederation of lwi.

A variation to extend the loan to February 2020 was agreed in 2016. A further variation to extend the loan was agreed in April 2021. The balance due (including interest) on payment of full and final settlement of historical Treaty of Waitangi Claims for Mokai Patea Confederation of lwi (to be known as Mōkai Pātea Waitangi Claims Trust (or any other names).

The total loan amount has been has been reduced from up to \$100,000 to up to \$70,000.

The loan balance as at 30.9.2022 is \$106,623 which includes \$5,182 of interest charged during the year.



Owhaoko B&D Trust

The original terms of the loan are:

Interest is payable at 5% per annum, the loan is unsecured and shall be repaid in full by the Borrower to the Lender on the earlier of 1 February 2015 or on payment for full and final settlement of the historical Treaty of Waitangi claims for Mokai Patea Confederation of Iwi. A variation to extend the loan to 1 February 2020 was agreed in 2016. A further variation was agreed in 2020 to extend the loan to 1 February 2025, or on payment for full and final settlement of historical Treaty of Waitangi claims for Mokai Patea Confederation of Iwi (to be known as Mōkai Pātea Waitangi Claims Trust (or any other names).

The total loan agreement is for up to \$100,000.

The loan balance as at 30.9.2022 is \$157,232 which includes \$7,487 of interest charged during the year.



Kaiao Rangi Trust

The original terms of the loan are:

Interest is payable at 5% per annum, the loan is unsecured and repayable on the earlier of 13 April 2023, or on full and final settlement of the historical Treaty of Waitangi claims for Mokai Patea Confederation of Iwi.

The total loan agreement is for up to \$100,000.

The loan balance as at 30.9.2022 is \$127,682 which includes \$6,080 of interest charged during the year.



Kaupeka Ki Runga Trust

The original terms of the loan are:

Interest is payable at 5% per annum, the loan is unsecured and repayable on the earlier of 13 June 2023, or on full and final settlement of the historical Treaty of Waitangi claims for Mokai Patea Confederation of Iwi.

The total loan agreement is for up to \$100,000.

The loan balance as at 30.9.2022 is \$126,401 which includes \$6,019 of interest charged during the year.



Whakauae Research Services Limited

The original terms of the loan are:

Interest is payable at 5% per annum, the loan is unsecured and repayable on the earlier of 20 August 2025, or on full and final settlement of the historical Treaty of Waitangi claims for Mokai Patea Confederation of Iwi.

The total loan agreement is for up to \$100,000.

The loan balance as at 30.9.2022 is \$116,413 which includes \$5,543 of interest charged during the year.

10. Related Parties

Barbara Ball, Deputy Chair, also acts as Trustee for Kaupeka Ki Runga, who provide a loan facility to the Trust. Barbara is also Chair of Mokai Patea Services Trust which MPWCT has a contract of services arrangement with, and Trustee on Owhaoko B&D Trust who provide a loan facility to MPWCT. Please refer to the Analysis of Liabilities note for further detail regarding the loan facilities for Kaupeka Ki Runga and Owhaoko B&D Trust.

Richard Steedman, who provides services as a Strategic Advisor Matauranga Mokai Patea, is also contracted as a Negotiator from November 2021. Richard is also the Chairperson of Owhaoko B&D Trust, Chairperson of Kaupeka Ki Runga, and a Trustee of Kaiaorangi Trust who each provide loan facilities to the Trust. Please refer to the Analysis of Liabilities note for further detail.

Moira Raukawa-Haskell, also acts as Trustee for Kaiao Rangi Trust, and is also Chair of Ngati Tamakopiri the Governance arm of Kaiao Rangi Trust.

Hari Benevides is a Trustee of Kaiao Rangi Trust and a member of the Tamakopiri Runanga.



10. Related Parties

Utiku Potaka, Thomas Curtis and Peter Fraser are delegates to Te Runanga o Ngati Hauiti which is the overeaching governing body for Te Maru o Ruahine Trust which in turn is the shareholder for Whakauae Research Services. Whakauae Research Services Ltd has provided loan facilities to the Trust. Thomas Cutis is also a Trustee of Te Maru o Ruahine Trust.

Maraea Bellamy is a Trustee of Mokai Patea Services Trust which MPWCT has a contract for services arrangement.

Mokai Patea Waitangi Claims Trust has trustees in common with Te Kete Manawa Trust. At balance date, there was \$1,000 owing to Te Kete Manawa Trust.



11. Events After the Balance Date

There were no other events that have occurred after the balance date that would have a material impact on the Performance Report (Last year - nil).

12. Ability to Continue Operating

The Trust continues to operate whilst in a net liability position as at 30 September 2022. As such, the Trustees have considered the continued use of the going concern assumption in the preparation of these financial statements.

The Trust is still in the early stages of Settlement Negotiations with the crown for the comprehensive settlement of historical claims of Mokai Patea Nui Tonu in relation to the Te Tiriti o Waitangi. The Waitangi Tribunal hearings in the Wai:2180 Taihape Inquiry in which the Trust has participated through contract funding from CFRT, concluded in October 2021. The Trust became a contracted approved client of CFRT for Settlement Negotiations after the Deed of Mandate was recognised by the Crown. From that time the Trust is also eligible for funding from Te Arawhiti for Settlement Negotiation work, for costs not covered by the CFRT contract.
